I myself have ventured forth only modestly, but I have been inspired by his perambulations to create the present rnigma.
Within the grid below, I ask you to draw a path connecting the centres of horizontally and vertically adjacent squares. Your path should form a single loop that neither touches nor crosses itself, but that passes through each and every circle found in the grid.
Please ensure that your path makes a right-angled turn at every black circle, and that it does not make any turn in the squares just before or after that circle. Contrarivise, at white circles, your loop may not turn, but it must turn in at least one of the squares either before or after that circle.

Once you've completed your loop, you can move on to finding the final answer to my ænigma. Locate in your grid all of the squares through which your path does not pass. Reading the letters in those squares in order, left-to-right and top-to-bottom, will reveal a clue to your final answer.
