The irregular grid below represents my own stained-glass window, with the regions outlined by the grid lines being the tiny panes of glass. I pray you will *blacken* some of those regions according to the clues provided by the little dots:


More than half of the regions surrounding a *black* dot must be blackened, but around a *white* dot, more than half of them must remain *unblackened*. Surrounding a *grey* dot, *exactly* half of the regions are to be blackened.


